

# LP Pathfinders: top Instagrams from June 2016





Why we like it: Not only is this a great silhouette of a man leading a camel, it also has perfect placement of the sun setting on the horizon. ## PAJE, ZANZIBAR




## THE FORBIDDEN CITY, BEIJING, CHINA

Why we like it: It's easy to engage with this image because of the strong directional lines that carry our eyes through the curved moat to the bridge and then to the golden brown roofline and red barrier around the palace. After a moment of studying the intricate details we move our eyes back to the moat and contemplate the boat slightly askew before we wander up through the curved waterway again and repeat the process.

Why we like it: The framing of this image is excellent in the foreground, middle ground and background. Placing the wildflowers at the bottom of the image gives it just a little more color and solves the problem of having the large sandy ground around the lake.
